2024: What Did We Do?

Feedback Forums on Induction of Labour

MVP co-chairs hosted two in-depth feedback forums on induction of labour to hear from service users and learn from their experiences. One forum was in-person in Portsoy, Banff and the second was an online event targeted at women and birthing people in Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire.

While many attendees shared difficult experiences, they did also share positive examples of the care they received and appreciated the opportunity to share their story in a safe and supported environment.

Key themes for improvement included: lack of information antenatally to make informed decisions, distance from Aberdeen (for Moray families), lack of individualised care/choices during labour, inconsistent processes and protocols, challenges with postnatal care and lasting mental health impact.

"Unfortunately it's the bad stuff you remember. It's the one comment that really sticks with you"

"I felt like I was meant to follow a manual"

We shared the feedback with the NHS Grampian Induction of Labour working group, the maternity senior leadership team and through both Grampian MVP groups and through the Scottish Government Maternity Oversight group (overseeing Elgin upgrade).

The feedback has been used to inform the working group's plans and their next steps include : developing an educational video on induction of labour to be shared antenatally that can better support women to make informed choices and carrying out research on midwife-led induction of labour to explore if induction of labour can take place on the midwife-led unit in future.

Supporting research studies

We reviewed and gave feedback on documents for a range of research studies including a study to recruit women planning an elective C-section who would be willing to donate placental, umbilical cord and amniotic fluid samples. We also circulated a range of opportunities for research engagement through our social media page.



Grampian Maternity User Survey

MVP lay members carried out our second biannual online survey in October 2024 and received over 180 responses from people that had given birth between 2022 and 2024. The survey focused on post-natal care, birth experiences as well as care for families who have experienced baby loss. We'll share the survey results later in 2025.

Moray Maternity Service Engagement

The Moray & Banff MVP continues to be a key stakeholder in the discussions with the Scottish Government and NHSG on Moray maternity services. This has included meetings with the Scottish Government Maternity Oversight group as well as joining <u>Keep Mum</u> for regular Maternity Collaborative meetings with the NHS team leading the Elgin changes.

Improving Birth in Grampian website

MVP members have collaborated with NHS Grampian colleagues to co-create and update website content on the Birth in Grampian website on topics including: Involving You, Feeding your Baby and Feedback.

2024: What Did We Do?



National Participation

MVP members have been working nationally with the Scottish Perinatal Network to support the development of a National Maternity Engagement Framework and Toolkit. The final document was published in 2024 September and it recommends that all NHS Boards in Scotland adopt an MVP model.



Engaging with the Third Sector

Latnem and Keep Mum both have representatives on the MVP and we have engaged with them closely around topics including maternal mental health and changes to Moray Maternity Services. Sands also have a representative on the MVP and supported with survey design. We also visited <u>Mum Days</u> in Moray to get feedback from their members. Furthermore, representatives from Moray Council, <u>Home-Start</u>, NCT, <u>MISS</u>, PEEP, <u>Action on Post-Partum Psychosis</u>, and <u>Step</u> by Step have contributed to and attended meetings.

Improving data and information sharing

MVP members have worked closely with NHS Grampian colleagues to support the development of updated maternity infographics, now shared on a quarterly basis by <u>NHS Grampian</u>. The new maternity statistics clearly present key data points and bring in new data that wasn't reported on previously such as the induction rate. Feedback has generally been positive and the team remain open to making further tweaks and adjustments as needed.





Co-creating resources

We have reviewed and input into a range of resources created by the NHS and other related health organisations to ensure that a service user perspective is considered. This includes a NHS leaflet on Anti-D in pregnancy, a NHS leaflet on place of birth decisions, Healthcare Improvement Scotland's anti-racism plan and equality consultation, a Public Health Scotland review of the national pregnancy and newborn screening information and more.

Spotlight on feedback mechanisms


We have also worked with NHS Grampian to explore the different feedback mechanisms available for service users to share their experience and feedback on maternity services. This has included attending an online session on the <u>Care Opinion platform</u>. After mapping out how these link together, the next steps are to share this information further so that service users are able to choose the right feedback option for their needs and preferences.
